

WHY IS NOTHING BEING DONE?

IT'S GETTING HOT IN HERE!

A heat dome is an extreme weather event where hot air is trapped over an area. This leads to extreme heat.

In 2021, B.C. had a heat dome. Here are the numbers:

115

heat-related illness (HRI) claims from workers filed in July 2021

26%

of claims were from construction services

32%

of those affected were young, male workers



JUST ADD WATER...?

The law in B.C. does not protect workers from extreme heat. Employers are required to provide drinking water — but that's it!

It's not enough.



These states in the USA have climates similar to B.C.

The difference is that they have more detailed protections for workers during extreme heat events.

These laws are also heat-triggered. Meaning, once it hits a certain temperature, employers are legally required to enforce protections.

Their HRI reports have gone down because of this.

Open work permits for all workers

• Free, reliable public transportation ♠↑

Minimum wage increase

15 paid sick days
